FAFSA

Federal Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

The Federal Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) should have opened on or around December 31st, 2023. The FAFSA form is an application for federal student aid. Filling it out can help students pay for college or career school. The state of Indiana is also now requiring that every senior file the FAFSA at www.studentaid.gov.

Step 1: Create an FSA ID. Please note: Parents or guardians of students who have a sibling who has already attended college may already have an FSA ID. It may take a few days to get your FSA ID after creating it so plan ahead.

Step 2: Complete the FAFSA

Step 3: Ensure that the information is accurate and you get a confirmation email.



SCHOOL NURSE NEWS

CDC Updated Virus Recommendations which includes COVID Guidance:

- Stay up to date with vaccinations to protect people against serious illness, hospitalization, and death. This includes Flu, COVID-19, and RSV.
- Practice good hygiene by covering coughs and sneezes, washing and sanitizing hands often and cleaning frequently touched surfaces.
- Taking steps for cleaner air, such as bringing in more fresh outside air, purifying indoor air, or gathering outdoors.

When people get sick with a respiratory virus, the updated guidance recommends that they stay home and away from others. For people with COVID-19 and influenza, treatment is available and can lessen symptoms and lower the risk of severe illness. The recommendations suggest returning to normal activities when:

- For at least 24 hours symptoms are improving
- If a fever was present, it has been gone for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication.
- Once people can return to normal activity, they are encouraged to take additional prevention strategies for the next 5 days such as wearing a well-fitting mask, enhancing hygiene practices, keeping a distance from others, and/or getting tested for respiratory viruses.

Please review these information sheets provided from the Indiana Department of Health and the Indiana Department of Education. This information will help parents decide whether or not your student is well enough to attend school.

IMMUNIZATIONS

IC 20-34-4 requires that all children enrolled in an accredited school shall have the required immunizations. Now is a good time to review your child's immunization records and make an appointment for your child to receive needed vaccinations for the next school year. You can make an appointment at your doctor's office or at the Jackson County Health Department for your child to receive these vaccinations. Appointment times fill up quickly especially at the end of the summer.



General Wellness Screening for Parents


Every morning before you send your child to school please check for signs of illness:




FEVER 100.4* OR CHILLS *or school board policy if threshold is lower




COUGH* OR SHORTNESS OF BREATH *especially new onset, uncontrolled cough



DIARRHEA, NAUSEA OR VOMITING, ABDOMINAL PAIN



HEADACHE* *particularly new onset of severe headache, especially with fever




SORE THROAT

Does your child have any sign of illness above?

If yes, consider their history. For example, does the child have a chronic health condition (allergies, asthma) that can mimic a viral illness? When in doubt, keep your student home until symptoms improve.

- If you check any of the boxes, **DO NOT** send your student to school. Instead, please keep your student home until they meet the criteria to return to school.
- Follow your school policy for returning to school.

How Sick is too Sick?

This information sheet is designed to be used as a general guidance for parents. If parents have medical questions, they are encouraged to consult with a healthcare provider.

| Symptom | Send to School | Keep at Home |
|-------------------------|---|--|
| Fever | During the past 24 hours, the student's temperature has been below 100.4 degrees and no fever-reducing medication has been taken. | During the past 24 hours, the student's temperature has been more than 100.4 degrees. |
| Diarrhea | During the past 24 hours, no more than one watery stool has occurred. | During the past 24 hours, more than one watery stool has occurred. |
| Vomiting | During the past 24 hours, no vomiting has occurred. | During the past 24 hours, vomiting has occurred. |
| Eye Irritation | Eyes may be itchy, but are not red, crusty, or draining. | Eyes are pink, draining, crusty, itching, painful, sensitive to light, or student has vision changes. |
| Cough/Runny Nose | Slight cough or runny nose, but no fever, and the student is able to cover cough, blow nose, and wash hands. | Symptoms are severe enough that the student is unable to learn. The student has a fever, or is unable to cover cough, blow nose, or wash hands. |
| Rash | Rash is not draining or spreading. The student does not have a fever, and symptoms of itching are not severe enough to impede learning. | Rash is bothersome and distracting. The student has a fever or severe itching, or rash is spreading or draining. |
| Asthma | Symptoms are well controlled, and the student knows when to contact a school adult for assistance or the student has an asthma action plan on file at the school and is following the plan. | Symptoms are not well controlled. The student is not able to recognize when he/she needs assistance, and no asthma action plan is on file at the school. |
