Dear Seymour High School Parents,

As the proud principal of Seymour High School, I am thrilled to share with you some of the wonderful things that have transpired at our school throughout the first nine weeks of this academic year. It has been a remarkable start, filled with achievements, celebrations, and opportunities for our students.

We launched the school year with a **ribbon-cutting ceremony** that officially opened our building following a **\$52 million construction project**. This event marked a significant milestone for our community, and we were delighted to celebrate our new facilities. Later, we enjoyed our **Homecoming Festivities**, where we opened up the school for the community to tour and partake in a rededication ceremony.

Our seniors have been diligently preparing for their futures. They participated in **senior seminars** with Ivy Tech, crafted resumes, engaged in **senior interviews** with the Jackson County Industrial Development Corporation (JCIDC), and joined us for our **College Fair and Financial Aid Night**. It has been inspiring to see their enthusiasm and commitment to their post-secondary plans.

Our academic success continues to impress. A total of **25 different students** received **Academic Honors** from the College Board, with special commendations awarded to **Eli Downey and Abram Yee** for their outstanding achievements on the PSAT and SAT. Additionally, **51 students** were named **Owls of the Month**, and hundreds earned places on the **High Honor Roll and Honor Roll**.

The fall sports season has also been a tremendous success. Our **boys soccer** and **tennis teams** were crowned sectional champions, while our **girls golf** and both our **boys and girls cross country teams** advanced to regionals in their state competitions. We are proud of our athletes and their hard work.

We remain committed to providing a wide range of academic options for our students, offering **34 different career pathway options**. Students have successfully completed construction and landscaping projects within the community and are gaining valuable experience as future nurses, teachers, chefs, and beyond. Our **agriculture, manufacturing and welding** programs are thriving, and we recently received a state-of-the-art forklift from Toyota to enhance our students' learning experiences.

Our fine arts programs had a fantastic first nine weeks as well. The **Seymour Marching Owls and Guards** performed at parades and football games, captivating large audiences. The **Seymour Owl Theater Company** produced a successful rendition of **Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs**, and our **Choral Department** is gearing up for their upcoming production of **SpongeBob the Musical**.

We are incredibly proud of the opportunities we have created for our students. More importantly, we are proud of our students for their hard work and dedication in taking advantage of these opportunities. At Seymour High School, we are large enough to provide a world of opportunities yet small enough to offer the personal touches that students and families deserve.

The students at Seymour High School have been committed to completing community service hours this fall. Collectively, students have a total of approximately **1,900 hours** so far this semester!


C4 Field Trip Reminder

Date: Thursday, January 16th


Permission slips will be handed out the first week of January and due Wednesday, January 15th.





Quick Band Facts:

Three SHS band directors, Mr. Cottrill, Mr. Johnston and Ms. Sturgell. 275 students participate in band at SHS. Band is a year-long season. It never ends but it changes to another musical genre. Marching season changes to concert band in late October, concert band coincides with basketball pep band and jazz band, solo and ensemble preparation happens in December/January. Most band students will perform several hundred pieces of music in four years. Many band students know how to play more than one instrument. Of the 275 band/color guard students, nearly 100 participate in at least one sport at SHS.



- Quedarse en casa cuando esté enfermo.


