- 1. Seniors and Parents: As we receive information about scholarships, we post those to our website. Please visit this page frequently to find new scholarship postings.
- 2. **Free Application for Federal Student Aid** (FAFSA®): The General Assembly has recently passed legislation requiring all high school senior families to complete the FAFSA. This year the application process will be simplified, however details are not yet available from the federal government. We will send out information about completing the FAFSA as soon as details are made available. <u>Click here</u> for more information about the FAFSA and to get started creating your FSA ID which is required when completing the FAFSA.
- 3. Junior and Seniors are invited to register for our College Visits @ SHS. 

Universal Design for Learning Cultivating a Sense of Belonging for All Students

Seymour High School is implementing Universal Design for Learning (UDL), a proven framework for creating learning experiences that are accessible to and inclusive of all learners. It is based on the idea that everyone learns differently, and that we can design instruction to provide multiple ways for students to access and demonstrate knowledge.

UDL has three main principles:

- Provide multiple means of representation: This means 1) presenting information in a variety of ways, such as through text, images, audio, and video; as well as 2) providing students with options to learn the information or skill, such as offering a choice to work in groups or individually, or allowing them to use different tools and materials to create their work.
- Provide multiple means of action and expression: This means giving students multiple ways to demonstrate what they know, such as through writing, speaking, drawing, or creating. This can be done by providing students with different types of writing prompts, offering them opportunities to work in groups or individually, or allowing them to use different tools and materials to create their work.
- Provide multiple means of engagement: This means creating learning experiences that are motivating and interesting to all students. This can be done by using games, simulations, or other active learning strategies, or by incorporating student interests into the curriculum.



Quick band facts:

Three SHS band directors, Mr. Cottrill, Mr. Johnston and Mrs. Carroll. 225 students participate in band at SHS. Band is a year-long season. It never ends but it changes to another musical genre. Marching season changes to concert band, concert band coincides with basketball pep band and jazz band, solo and ensemble preparation happens in December/January. Most band students will perform several hundred pieces of music in four years. Many band students know how to play more than one instrument.
